EVENT HAS BEEN MODIFIED:

This will be a mostly outdoor program, taking place on nature center trails or in the parking lot area. Two new features will be a “barrel train” ride for children and a “Trunk& Treat” area organized by Calvary Church youth, both in the HANC parking lot area. There will again be an outdoor story trail with carnival games, starting at the HANC building entrance. Volunteer tour guides will lead walking groups of 12-15 people along the story route to view themed dioramas and enjoy table games. There will be an outdoor live owl presentation near the building entrance. The only indoor activity will be a short Halloween craft offered at spaced tables inside the building.

Program participants and staff are responsible for pre-screening for COVID-19 symptoms prior to arriving at an activity. Individuals who have or live with someone who displays symptoms of COVID-19, have a fever of 100.4 or above, or other COVID-19 symptoms, should stay home and not attend the activity.

SOCIAL DISTANCING INFORMATION:

Participant groups are encouraged to maintain a 6’ distance between themselves and other participant groups. The event will provide multiple activities so that participants can move about and space themselves as desired.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE INFORMATION:

Registered participants will check in at a registration tent by the parking lot entrance. Each child will receive a treat bag to fill at various event stops as well as an admission bracelet and one ticket for the barrel train ride. Walk-in admittance on the day of event will be allowed depending on available openings at the end of pre-registration (up to the event maximum of 400) on Friday, Oct 29, 4:30pm.

BASIC CLEANING INFORMATION:

Game tables, picnic area and HANC building activities will provide hand sanitizer for participant use.

FACIAL COVERING INFORMATION:

Outdoor activities: participants are not required to wear face coverings outdoors, but are at risk for getting and spreading the virus that causes COVID-19. The Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) **strongly recommend** that anyone who is not fully vaccinated continue to wear face coverings outdoors when social distancing cannot be maintained.

Inside the HANC building: all staff, volunteers and participants 2+ years will be required to wear face coverings while inside the nature center. All persons will provide their own face coverings.

It is important to note that all Roseville Parks and Recreation programs follow the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and MDH guidelines for Recreational Programs. Please be aware there is some risk in participating in any activity during the pandemic. Even though we are working to provide as safe as an environment as possible, 100% mitigation cannot be guaranteed for any activity.
